Introduction to Liturgy

9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. Murray Kroetsch

This introductory course lays out the foundations for understanding the nature of the Church's liturgy. It introduces participants to the building blocks of the liturgy: paschal mystery, ritual, symbol and song, sacramentality, the assembly and ministries, liturgical time and space, the Word of God, corporate prayer, and the liturgical books and documents of the post-conciliar Church.

Body and Spirit in Liturgy

9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. Roy Roberts

Liturgy reveals to us our God, and communicates to us our own identity. This course explores the integral role of the liturgical life as primary source for a Christian spirituality by exploring how we celebrate and what that communicates.

General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)

10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m. Bill Burke

The revised GIRM comes at a time when the liturgical renewal of the church is at a crossroads. This course examines the operative theology in the GIRM and its pastoral and ecclesial implications.

The Initiation of Children

10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m. Catherine Ecker

and Heather Reid

This course examines the unity of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist) and various pastoral issues. The course explores the role of the parish, family, and school, and addresses issues that arise when adapting the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults for children of catechetical age.

Lectionary: The Bible and Liturgy

1:30 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. Normand Bonneau

This course explores the history of the Sunday Lectionary, including its renewal by Vatican II, and the structure of its liturgical season. The course also offers some practical observations on how liturgy uses the Bible through the Lectionary.

Liturgical Praxis

1:30 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. Bernadette Gasslein

This course explores how the theology of the GIRM translates into practice in various liturgical celebrations: Eucharist and other sacramental celebrations, Sunday Celebrations of the Word and Liturgy of the Hours. This course dovetails well with the course on the theology of the GIRM and enables students to practice what is theologized.

Synthesis Course for Graduates

7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. Patty Fowler and Myrtle Power

(Monday through Thursday of each week)
This course provides a practical integration experience for participants completing the certificate. "Unless adult Christians engage in critical and conscious theological reflection, the Christian community's faithfulness to the gospel and its authentic witness to that gospel in the world diminishes" Patricia O'Connell Killen, *The Art of Theological Reflection*.

The Summer Institute in Pastoral Liturgy

Responding to Vatican II and the Church's call for ongoing liturgical renewal, the Faculty of Theology at Saint Paul University, in close cooperation with the National Office for Liturgy of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, established the Summer Institute in Pastoral Liturgy.

THE AIM

The aim of SIPL is to enable those who prepare, lead and evaluate the liturgical activity of the Church (parish liturgy committee members, ministers, musicians, catechists, clergy, religious and seminarians) to become more familiar with the various liturgical rites of the Church and to develop skills useful for liturgical ministry. SIPL is staffed mainly by Canadians who hold graduate degrees in pastoral liturgy or related fields.

The session normally runs for two weeks, Monday through Friday, with a usual course load of three courses per summer. Each course is one and a half hours per day. Students can earn a Pastoral Certificate in Liturgy which consists of six core courses, three electives and the practicum modules. A full-time participant would therefore be eligible for the Certificate after three summers.



THO 2160 Pastoral Liturgy (3 cr.)

Students can earn three credits from the Faculty of Theology by taking three approved SIPL courses and writing one additional research paper due August 20, 2009.
